Narrowing the gap summative information:

Narrowing the gap KS1 predictions for 2013

Reading-Disadvantaged pupils were significantly below (35%) those of non-disadvantaged pupils 2012 and below those nationally. 2013 predictions show that 100% of disadvantaged pupils will achieve a level 2 reading above those of non-disadvantaged and gap will be reversed by 7.5%.
Writing-Although the gap was not a large as in reading below (17%) those of non-disadvantaged pupils 2012 and below those nationally. 2013 predictions shows that 71% will achieve a level 2 or better with a gap of 16% below non-disadvantaged pupils.

Mathematics-Disadvantaged pupils were significantly below (32%) those of non-disadvantaged pupils 2012 and below those nationally. 2013 predictions show that 100% of disadvantaged pupils will achieve a level 2 mathematics above those of non-disadvantaged and gap will be reversed by 7.5% and above national.

Action to reduce gap in writing

Narrowing the gap predictions for KS2 2013

English

2012 88% of disadvantaged pupils achieved expected progress, while 100% of non-disadvantaged pupils achieved expected progress (gap of 12%= 1child) although achieved in line with national levels. 2013 predictions are 100% of both disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged will achieve their expected progress. 2014 predictions are also 100% to have achieved expected progress.

Maths

2012 100% of both disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged achieved expected progress. 2013 predictions are 86% (1 child not on track to achieve level 5) disadvantaged children will achieve expected progress and 100% of non-disadvantaged children will achieve their expected progress. 2014 predictions are also 100% to have achieved expected progress.
