

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### **Key Vocabulary**

- CVC word— a word that is made up of a consonant, vowel, consonant e.g. c-a-t
- **Tricky word** a word that cannot be sounded out easily e.g. the

Children will begin to learn how to use their phonic knowledge to start to decode VC and CVC words. They will learn to read tricky words and simple phrases. They will use this knowledge to understand unfamiliar vocabulary.
